He asked her name, she wrote it on a tabletop, and he did the same. Though she left without ever seeing him again, it was an enchanting, unforgettable interlude. Years later, Magda finds herself to be much more reserved and experienced- until someone reads her palm and tells her that, like a swallow, she will fly back to love. Now disguised as the shop girl she once was long ago, Magda runs off for an evening of adventure at the Bullier. There, she meets another young man and begins to relive that magical night from her past she so longs for. Her wealthy protector finds her to tell her he hopes she won't regret her decision. Nevertheless, she runs off with her new beau to a romantic getaway on the Riviera. Magda is happy, but knows that her shocking past will ruin her young lover.
